Mayor's Message by Brandon Paulin

Spring.... Well maybe it doesn't feel like it yet, but warm weather is around the corner! I hope you can join us for our many events this spring starting with our always fun Easter egg hunt!

A little "Did you know?" that in Indian Head from February 7th-14th the Town Council declared that week be "Congenital Heart Defect Awareness week". As many of you may know my little brother (Hunter) was born with many different heart defects. His Destination Imagination team as a project for this year has decided to spread awareness about Heart disease/defects and raise money to put an AED at the Village Green Pavilion. Their goal is to make people aware about numerous kinds of heart diseases and defects and make our Town facility safer. AEDs save approximately 40,000 lives per year and we are happy that they thought of us while doing their community project. Remember to like them on Facebook at "Create Our Community" and help out toward their cause/project.

UPDATE. The Boardwalk project is moving forward. As our Town manager said last Town Meeting the State has approved the funding from a 50/50 match to an 80/20 match which means the state will contribute 3.3 million dollars to the project. We are currently working to renew all permits. Hope to begin work in the Spring 2018. Town working on a Concurrence In Award checklist

from the State.

Another UPDATE, The Ely's property is progressing. The Southern Maryland delegation unanimously supports the demolition of Ely's and recommends that funds be allocated to tear it down. The funds would come from DHCD's (Department of Housing and Community Development) Strategic Demolition Fund and the request is for \$550,000 to remediate mold, asbestos, and tear down the blighted former Elys shopping center. This fund grants money to towns and non-profits to remove blighted and boarded up properties (perfect example is Ely's). We are committed to removing this blight, bringing in the College of Southern Maryland, and promoting further business growth in Town. I want to sincerely thank our State Delegation, DHCD, CSM, the developers, and the Town for working hard to make this happen. This project is a necessary component to remove blight, create jobs, and revitalize Indian Head.

Spring Cleaning is a Good Time to Think about Home Fire Safety

With the coming of Spring our thoughts turn to warmer temperatures and Spring Cleaning. This time of year is a good time to do a thorough cleaning of our homes and yards. In an effort to remind everyone that your “Spring Cleaning” project should also be a time to remember fire safety, the Indian Head Volunteer Fire Department would like to remind everyone of the following safety tips.

When cleaning the inside of your home, don’t forget to check these vital life safety devices and areas thoroughly.

- Remember that smoke alarms increase your chances of surviving a home fire by 50% so be sure to check these devices for proper operation and be sure to clean them by vacuuming them as part of your cleaning.
- Check the age of the smoke alarms, they should be replaced every ten years according to the manufacturers of the devices.
- **As a reminder, in the state of Maryland, if you replace your smoke alarms you must replace them with a new 10 year battery life battery alarm.**
- Be sure to test your smoke alarms. If they are not working properly, it’s time to replace them.
- At minimum, there should be at least one smoke alarm on every floor of your home.
- Test your carbon monoxide alarms, and replace any alarms that are 7 years old or older.
- If you have a fire extinguisher in your home this is a good time to check it and replace if necessary. If you have an ABC Dry Powder extinguisher it needs to be replaced every 12 years.
- This is a good time to check all electrical equipment and appliances for damaged or frayed cords and replace them if necessary.
- Be sure to check your electrical outlets to ensure that they’re not overloaded or damaged.
- Remember to check for lint buildup from your dryer in the hose and vents. Dryer fires are rapidly becoming a major cause of home fires.
- Clean your oven and stove making sure you get all the grease and unwanted buildup to prevent a fire.

Pay special attention to more than the pretty flowers when outside!

- Be sure to remove all outdoor debris and dead vegetation away from home to help reduce the potential of a fire starting in your yard and extending to your home.
- **As a reminder, these items need be properly disposed of by recycling or through the Town. Do not attempt to burn these items as there is no outdoor burning permitted within in the Town limits**
- Be sure your address numbers are visible for all Emergency Services to see in the event of an emergency and if needed replace the numbers with new ones.
- All fuels for lawn and garden equipment should be stored in an approved container and never stored in your home or attached garage.
- As part of our Spring Cleaning, many of us take this opportunity to get rid of many of the old and/or unwanted household chemicals and yard fertilizers. As a reminder these chemicals should be sorted in their original containers and properly disposed of at the Charles County landfill at no cost to you.

Here are a few examples of these types of products:

- Pesticides, fertilizers and weed killers
- Pool chemicals
- Paint and thinners
- Gasoline or other flammable/combustible liquids
- **NEVER** dispose of these types of products in the trash as they could leak causing a chemical reaction and possibly start a fire.

Grilling Safety

- Barbeque gas grills should be thoroughly inspected, including gas hoses, connections, burners and propane tanks should be inspected prior to use.
- Any old charcoal should be disposed of properly. Once charcoal gets wet it can spontaneously self-combust once it dries.
- **As a reminder, it is against the Maryland State Fire Laws to grill on a balcony and you could face possible fines if you are found grilling on a balcony.**

By following these simple safety tips while performing your annual Spring Cleanup you can greatly improve your family's safety and reduce your chances of a fire in your home. Town of Indian Head Useful Information

Holiday Closings

Town Hall, Public Works and the Community Affairs Office will be closed on the following days this quarter in observance of the holidays listed:

If you have a water or sewer emergency after hours, call 301-743-2222 to report your emergency. On-call Town personnel will be contacted and the problem will be handled accordingly.

After hours non-emergency type problems can be reported by leaving a message on the Town Hall office number 301-743-5511. Be prepared to furnish your name, address, phone number and brief, but detailed description of the type of problem. Water cut-offs for non-payment are not considered emergencies and are only handled during Public Works regular business hours.

Town Codes

- **Burning**—No burning is allowed within the Town limits.
- **Animal Control**—Dogs must be kept on the owner's property unless properly restrained. The Charles County Animal Control provides animal enforcement within the Town. Call 301-932-1713 if you have a problem.
- **Abandoned or Inoperative Vehicles** are prohibited within the Town and may not be kept on the street for more than 24 hours or on private property, with certain exceptions. Call Code Enforcement at 301-743-5511 ext. 101 with any questions.
- **Property Maintenance**—Every dwelling and lot shall be kept free from trash and garbage. Weeds and grass must be cut and kept shorter than 10 inches.
- **Building Code**—The Town has an adopted building code. Any new construction or remodeling, including, but not limited to porches, fences, sheds and garages, requires inspection and a building permit from the Town.

Recycling/Yard Waste

Solid waste products such as glass jars and bottles, newspapers, plastic bottles and metal cans will be picked up at the curb every Thursday within the Town of Indian Head. Place these items in your recycling bin - no need to separate them. Have them curbside by 7:00am.

Yard waste will be collected on Wednesdays, year-round, weather permitting. Grass clippings and leaves must be placed in brown paper bags or in a trash container marked "Yard Waste" and placed at curbside. Brush must be bundled and must not be any longer than four feet (4') in length. Individual pieces of brush must not be any larger than six inches (6") in diameter.

Bulk trash can now be scheduled year-round on Wednesdays. Fee of \$50 (cash, money order, debit/credit **ONLY**) per scheduled pick-up must be paid in advance at time of scheduling at Town Hall. All items must be curbside by 7:00am on the prescheduled pick-up day but not earlier than 48 hours prior to pick-up day.

Utility Rates

The Town bills for utilities on a quarterly basis. Please make note that you will be receiving a bill four times a year (July, October, January and April). **You are encouraged to make an estimated payment monthly toward your quarterly bill.** For more information you can call Town Hall at 301-743-5511

(per dwelling unit per quarter) plus
\$6.85 for every 1,000 gallons used

Minimum rate for all commercial customers **\$212.80**

Bay Restoration Fee

\$15.00 to State of Maryland Comptroller's office for the Bay Restoration Fund

Trash Rates

Residential/Multiple Residential Rate: \$85.00 (per dwelling unit per quarter) - Billed quarterly for twice a week curb-side pickup and one (1) recyclable products pickup per week. (Trash must be in a 20 to 32 gallon metal or hard plastic trash container with a secured lid)

Commercial Rate:

Category I Dumpster (4cu yds) \$495.00 per qtr

Category II Maximum 2 cans \$95.00 per qtr

Each additional can \$46.00 per qtr



Items Accepted free of charge include Automotive fluids, Fluorescent lights, Degreasers, Pesticides, Herbicides, Fertilizer, Gasoline, Oil-based paints (except Latex-must be solidified in can & disposed of in household trash), Cleaning supplies, Pool chemicals, Rust removers, and other Poisons around the house.

Items NOT Accepted: Ammunition, Bio/Medical wastes (sharps, needles, bodily fluids), Prescription drugs, Commercial hazardous waste, Latex paint (to solidify add kitty litter, shredded paper, paint hardener, or sawdust to paint in can to aid in drying it out)
