Press Release, Governor's Office of Small, Minority, and Women Business Affairs : State Agencies Collaborate to Help Small Businesses Compete with Confidence

ANNAPOLIS, MD – The Governor's Office of Small, Minority & Women Business Affairs today announced its 2019 Technical Training Classroom schedule. The 22 sessions, offered at no cost to small business owners and entrepreneurs, focus on improving operational efficiencies and navigating the state procurement process.

"Maryland is open for business and we want our small businesses to compete with confidence," said Jimmy Rhee, special secretary of the Governor's Office of Small, Minority & Women Business Affairs. "This program drew over 800 participants in 2018, and based on their feedback, it's making a positive difference."

Half of the programming will be provided by subject-matter-experts within state agencies. The [Maryland Department of Commerce](#), the [Department of General Services](#), and the [Department of Labor, Licensing & Regulation](#) will join the Governor's Office of Small, Minority & Women Business Affairs to cover topics such as state and federal procurement processes, eMarylandMarketplace tools, prevailing and living wage laws, and subcontractor rights and responsibilities within the Minority Business Enterprise Program.

"Maryland Commerce is pleased to be a part of this important program, as we want to make sure Maryland's entrepreneurs and small business owners have the tools and the training they need for their companies to succeed," said Maryland Commerce Secretary Mike Gill. "This program is a great resource for our small business community."

Small business resource organizations and small business owners lend their expertise to the program as well to round out the curriculum by covering topics such as proposal writing, marketing techniques, contract & price analysis, negotiation skills, and cash flow management.

The Technical Training Classroom offers a morning and afternoon session on the fourth Tuesday of each month (except December) at the Governor's Coordinating Offices located at 100 Community Place in Crownsville. Registration is free, but seating is limited and advance registration is required. 

Town of Indian Head Useful Information

Town Codes

- **Burning**—No burning is allowed within the Town limits.
- **Animal Control**—Dogs must be kept on the owner's property unless properly restrained. The Charles County Animal Control provides animal enforcement within the Town. Call 301-932-1713 if you have a problem.
- **Abandoned or Inoperative Vehicles** are prohibited within the Town and may not be kept on the street for more than 24 hours or on private property, with certain exceptions. Call Code Enforcement at 301-743-5511 ext. 101 with any questions.
- **Property Maintenance**—Every dwelling and lot shall be kept free from trash and garbage. Weeds and grass must be cut and kept shorter than 10 inches.
- **Building Code**—The Town has an adopted building code. Any new construction or remodeling, including, but not limited to porches, fences, sheds and garages, requires inspection and a building permit from the Town.

Code Enforcement

Planck administers the Residential Property Maintenance and Building Codes for the Town of Indian Head. The Code Enforcement Officer does daily inspections throughout Town to check for code compliance. When a property is not up to code, the Code Enforcement Officer will issue a violation letter to address the code violation. Depending on the type of violation, the days for corrective action can be between 7 to 30 days. After the specified number of days, a fine letter will be issued for an additional 7 to 30 days, followed by a citation if the violation has still not been addressed. At the time that the citation is issued, the violation may be taken to court, or the Town may complete the needed property maintenance and lien the property for any costs incurred. The Town's Code Enforcement also does rental license inspections, and building permit inspections.

If you have any questions about the Code Enforcement process, if you would like to report a Code Enforcement violation, or if you need to speak with the Code Enforcement Officer in reference to an inspection, please call 301-743-5511 ext. 101.

Recycling/Yard Waste

Solid waste products such as glass jars and bottles, newspapers, plastic bottles and metal cans will be picked up at the curb every Thursday within the Town of Indian Head. Place these items in your recycling bin - no need to separate them. Have them curbside by 7:00am.

Yard waste will be collected on Wednesdays, year-round, weather permitting. Grass clippings and leaves must be placed in brown paper bags or in a trash container marked "Yard Waste" and placed at curbside. Brush must be bundled and must not be any longer than four feet (4') in length. Individual pieces of brush must not be any larger than six inches (6") in diameter.

Bulk trash can now be scheduled year-round on Wednesdays. Fee of \$50 (cash, money order, debit/credit **ONLY**) per scheduled pick-up must be paid in advance at time of scheduling at Town Hall. All items must be curbside by 7:00am on the pre-scheduled pick-up day but not earlier than 48 hours prior to pick-up day.

Utility Rates

The Town bills for utilities on a quarterly basis. Please make note that you will be receiving a bill four times a year (July, October, January and April). **You are encouraged to make an estimated payment monthly toward your quarterly bill.** For more information you can call Town Hall at 301-743-5511

All residential and commercial units within the Town of Indian Head shall avail themselves of the Town's curb-side trash collection service.

Make Spring Cleaning a Fire Safety Priority

As we say good bye to winter, our thoughts turn to warmer temperatures, spring cleaning our homes and yards. A good spring housecleaning can significantly help promote fire safety in and around your home. Spring cleaning can take on another meaning, it's the ideal time to check homes and yards for dangerous materials and unsafe conditions and spend the time to protect families and properties. In an effort to help with this project, the Indian Head Volunteer Fire Department would like to provide the following safety tips.

When cleaning the inside of your home, don't forget to check these vital life safety devices and areas thoroughly.

- Smoke alarms increase your chances of surviving a home fire by 50% so be sure to check these devices for proper operation and be sure to clean them by vacuuming them as part of your cleaning.
- Check the age of the smoke alarms, they should be replaced every ten years according to the manufacturers of the devices.
- If you have a fire extinguisher in your home this is a good time to check it and replace if necessary. If you have an ABC Dry Powder extinguisher it needs to be replaced every 12 years.
- This is also a good time to check all electrical equipment and appliances for damaged or frayed cords and replace them if necessary.
- Be sure to check your electrical outlets to ensure that they're not overloaded or damaged.
- Remember to check for lint buildup from your dryer in the hose and vents.
- Clean your oven and stove making sure you get all the grease and unwanted buildup to prevent a fire.



- March 10th is Day-light Savings time, so when you change your clocks, you should also take the time to test and clean your smoke alarms. If they are not working properly, it's time to replace them.
- **As a reminder, in the state of Maryland, if you replace your smoke alarms you must replace them with a new 10-year sealed battery alarm.**
- If you or a neighbor are in need of a 10-year battery smoke alarm or if you have any questions or concerns about Fire Safety/Prevention, please contact the department at 301-753-9400 or 301-743-3900 or the Community Affairs office at 301-743-2479.

Pay special attention to more than the pretty flowers when outside!

- Be sure to remove all outdoor debris and dead vegetation away from home to help reduce the potential of a fire starting in your yard and extending to your home.
- **As a reminder, there is no outdoor burning or yard waste or trash permitted within in the Town limits.**
- Be sure your address number is in good condition and visible for all Emergency Services to see in the event of an emergency and if needed replace the numbers with new ones.
- Properly dispose of oily or greasy rags. If these items must be stored, they should be kept in labeled, sealed, metal containers.
- If you store gasoline, keep it outside your home in a shed or detached garage. Keep small quantities in tightly sealed containers. Use gasoline only as a motor fuel - never as a cleaning agent.
- Use outdoor barbecue grills with caution. Place in a safe area away from building, windows, heating, ventilation and air conditioning units or places with high/dead vegetation.
- Barbeque gas grills should be thoroughly inspected, including gas hoses, connections, burners and propane tanks should be inspected prior to use.
- **As a reminder, the use of any type of grill is prohibited on balconies in apartments or condominiums in accordance with the Maryland State Fire Laws.**
- As part of our Spring Cleaning, many of us take this opportunity to get rid of many of the old and/or unwanted household chemicals and yard fertilizers. As a reminder these chemicals should be sorted and remain in their original containers and properly disposed of at the Charles County landfill at no cost to you.

Here are a few examples of these types of products:

- Pesticides, fertilizers and weed killers
- Pool chemicals
- Paint and thinners
- Gasoline or other flammable/combustible liquids
- **NEVER** dispose of these types of products in the trash as they could leak causing a chemical reaction and possibly start a fire.

While performing your annual Spring Cleanup and by following these simple safety tips you can greatly improve your home safety and reduce your chances of a fire in your home. You can do a lot to protect yourself, your family and your property. In fact, you are the key to your safety. A little time spent on simple common sense prevention makes your house a safer place.
