Town Fall Leaf Vacuum Collection Begins November 4

Leaf Vacuum Collection is offered by the Town on Wednesdays during the fall season, weather permitting.

- Only leaves free of sticks, rocks and debris can be raked to the curb.
- Do not rake leaves into the paved portion of the streets or into the storm drains.
- Bagged leaves placed curbside will be picked up with other yard waste during the regular Wednesday year-round yard waste pick-up. Bagged leaves **MUST** be in biodegradable paper bags. The Town **WILL NOT** pick up leaves in plastic bags.
- Keep regular household trash containers separate from yard waste.
- Bagged yard waste may be placed curbside on Wednesdays year-round for pick-up.

Please be patient, due to large volume of leaves the entire Town cannot always be covered in a single day. The crew will conduct one complete pass through of the entire Town before doubling back on streets.

BURNING LEAVES IS NOT PERMITTED

NO OUTDOOR BURNING OF ANY KIND IS PERMITTED WITHIN THE TOWN LIMITS

Vacuum Collection is subject to weather. Should snow removal be required, the leaf vacuum will not operate.

Call the Town Hall to confirm leaf vacuum operation before raking your leaves to the curb. 301-743-5511 or 301-753-6633

LAST DAY for the Leaf Vacuum is January 1 or the first snow.

Town of Indian Head Useful Information

Town Codes

- **Burning**—No burning is allowed within the Town.
- **Animal Control**—Dogs must be kept on the owner’s property unless properly restrained. The Charles County Animal Control provides animal enforcement within the Town. Call 301-932-1713 if you have a problem.
- **Abandoned or Inoperative Vehicles** are prohibited within the Town and may not be kept on the street for more than 24 hours or on private property, with certain exceptions. Call Code Enforcement at 301-743-5511 ext. 101 with any questions.
- **Property Maintenance**—Every dwelling and lot shall be kept free from trash and garbage. Weeds and grass must be cut and kept shorter than 10 inches.
- **Building Code**—The Town has an adopted building code. Any new construction or remodeling, including, but not limited to porches, fences, sheds and garages, requires inspection and a building permit from the Town.

Code Enforcement

Planck administers the Residential Property Maintenance and Building Codes for the Town of Indian Head. The Code Enforcement Officer does daily inspections throughout Town to check for code compliance. When a property is not up to code, the Code Enforcement Officer will issue a violation letter to address the code violation. Depending on the type of violation, the days for corrective action can be between 7 to 30 days. After the specified number of days, a fine letter will be issued for an additional 7 to 30 days, followed by a citation if the violation has still not been addressed. At the time that the citation is issued, the violation may be taken to court, or the Town may complete the needed property maintenance and lien the property for any costs incurred. The Town’s Code Enforcement also does rental license inspections, and building permit inspections.

If you have any questions about the Code Enforcement process, if you would like to report a Code Enforcement violation, or if you need to speak with the Code Enforcement Officer in reference to an inspection, please call 301-743-5511 ext. 101.

Recycling/Yard Waste

Solid waste products such as glass jars and bottles, newspapers, plastic bottles and metal cans will be picked up at the curb every Thursday within the Town of Indian Head. Place these items in your recycling bin—no need to separate them.

Yard waste will be collected on Wednesdays, year-round, weather permitting. Grass clippings and leaves must be placed in brown paper bags or in a trash container marked “Yard Waste” and placed at curbside. Brush must be bundled and must not be any longer than four feet (4’) in length. Individual pieces of brush must not be any larger than six inches (6”) in diameter. Both Recycling and Yard Waste must be curbside by no later than 7:30AM. Bulk trash can be scheduled year-round on Wednesdays. Fee of \$50 (credit card, cash or money order **ONLY**) per scheduled pick-up must be paid in advance at time of scheduling. All items must be curbside by 7:30am on the pre-scheduled pick-up day but not earlier than 48 hours prior to pick-up day.

Utility Rates

The Town bills for utilities on a quarterly basis. Please make note that you will be receiving a bill four times a year (July, October, January and April). **You are encouraged to make an estimated payment monthly toward your quarterly bill.** For more information you can call Town Hall at: 301-743-5511.

\$15.00 to State of Maryland Comptroller’s office for the Bay Restoration Fund

Residential/Multiple Residential Rate: \$85.00 (per dwelling unit per quarter) - Billed quarterly for twice a week curbside pickup and one (1) recyclable products pickup per week.

FIRE SAFETY STARTS WITH YOU!



National Fire Prevention Week; October 4 – 10, 2020

This year's National Fire Prevention campaign is "Serve Up Fire Safety in the Kitchen" is designed to ensure we educate as well as practice Kitchen Safety every day.

- Did you know that cooking fires are the #1 cause of home fires and home fire injuries every year and unattended cooking is the leading cause of fires in the kitchen?
- Nearly half of all home fires involve cooking equipment, with unattended cooking being the most common cause of these fires, according to the NFPA.
- In addition, scald burns are the second leading cause of all burn injuries and hot liquids such as coffee and even microwave soup can cause devastating injuries.

The majority of these fires are preventable, so in an effort to prevent these types of incidents from happening in your home, The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) and Indian Head Volunteer Fire Department & Rescue Squad Inc. asks that everyone please follow these simple rules when cooking in the kitchen.

Stay Focused on Food – Unattended cooking is the leading cause of fires in the kitchen.

- Be sure to stay in the kitchen when you are frying, boiling, or broiling food. Turn off the burner if you leave the kitchen, even for a short period of time.
- If you are simmering, baking, or roasting food, be sure to check it regularly and **NEVER** leave the home.
- Use a timer to remind you that you are cooking.
- If you are sleepy, have consumed alcohol or have taken medication that might make you drowsy, do not cook. **Place a delivery order!**

Keep cooking areas clean and clear – Clear away all clutter and give cooking appliances space. Be sure to keep cleaning up food and grease on a regular basis, reducing the amount of grease and dust buildup.

- Keep anything that can catch fire such as oven mitts, towels, curtains, wood utensils and food wrappers away from the stovetop.
- Loose clothing can hang down or over a burner and catch fire. Wear short, close fitting or tightly rolled sleeves when cooking.
- Have a 3-foot “Kid Free Safe Zone” around the stove and areas where hot food or drinks are being prepared and served.
- Keep pets off of cooking surfaces and nearby countertops.

Put a lid on it – you can take simple steps to keep a small kitchen fire from getting out of control.

- Always keep a lid nearby when cooking. If a small grease fire starts, carefully slide the lid over the pan and turn the burner off. Leave the pan covered until it is cool and **NEVER** try to remove the pan from the burner or take it outside until it is completely cooled down.
- In case of an oven fire, **turn off the oven and keep the door closed** until the oven has cooled down. By opening the door, you are adding oxygen to the fire and it will grow. Have the oven serviced by a licensed repair company before attempting to reuse.
- If you have a microwave oven fire, turn the appliance off immediately and keep the door closed. Have a licensed repair technician service the appliance before attempting to reuse or simply replace it.
- **Never** discharge a portable fire extinguisher on a grease fire because it will cause the fire to spread by pushing the grease out of the pan.

Prevent Scalds and Burns – Hot liquids and steam from the stove or oven can cause devastating injuries.

- Turn pot handles away from the stove’s edge.
- Keep hot foods and liquids away from table and counter edges.
- Keep your face away from the oven door when checking or removing food so that the heat or steam cannot cause a burn.
- Open microwaved food slowly, away from your face. Let the food cool before eating.
- Keep all cords coiled and away from counter edges.



Smoke Alarms

Did you know that many people do not test their smoke alarms as often as they should? When there is a fire, smoke spreads fast. You need working smoke alarms to give you time to get out. Test yours every month! The Indian Head Volunteer Fire Department would like to remind everyone that you are the first link when it comes to Fire Safety for you and your family. Ensuring your families safety not only includes being fire safe but knowing what to do should you experience a fire at your home.


Almost two-thirds (62%) of reported home fire deaths resulted from fires in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.

On July 1, 2013, a change was made to the Maryland fire law regarding residential Smoke Alarms. In accordance to the new law, when replacing smoke alarms in your home, they must be a sealed battery unit with a 10-year life battery. If the alarms are hard-wired (electrical) with a battery backup and you are replacing them, they must have a sealed battery backup as well.

Here are some tips about installing and maintaining residential smoke alarms.

- Be sure to install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area and on every level of the home, including the basement.
- If possible, interconnect all smoke alarms throughout the home. When one sounds, they all sound.
- Be sure to replace smoke alarms every 10 years in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations. (All replaced alarms must have a 10-year sealed battery backup system).
- Be sure to test your smoke alarms at least monthly in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations.
- Working smoke alarms improve your chances of surviving a fire in your home by 50% and are an inexpensive device to ensure you and your family's safety.
- Smoke alarms that include a recordable voice announcement in addition to the usual alarm sound may be helpful in waking children through the use of a familiar voice.

- Smoke alarms are available for people who are deaf or hard of hearing. These devices use strobe lights. Vibration devices can be added to these alarms.
- The Indian Head Volunteer Fire Department and Rescue Squad Inc. would like to remind everyone that we have 10-year smoke alarms available for installation in your home at no cost to you or your family. These devices MUST be installed by the fire department in accordance with the Maryland law and cannot simply be handed out to the community.
- If your home needs these life saving devices you can either contact the fire station at 301-743-3900 or the Community Affairs office at 301-743-5574.



“Know Two Ways Out of Every Room”

Escape Planning

When fire strikes, the reality is that your home could be engulfed in smoke and flames in just a matter of a few minutes and your chances of escape reduced drastically. Should this happen, do you and your family know two ways out of your home? It is important to have and practice a home fire escape plan that prepares your family to think fast and get out quickly when the smoke alarm sounds. What if your first escape route is blocked by smoke or flames, would you know how to get out? That is why having an escape plan and knowing two ways out is such a key part of your plan. Remember that smoke alarms are an important part of a home fire escape plan.

- According to a National survey, only one-third of Americans have both developed and practiced a home fire escape plan.
- Almost three-quarters of Americans have an escape plan; however, less than half practiced it.
- One-third of American households think they would have at least 6 minutes before a fire in their home would become life threatening. Often the actual time is reduced to just a couple minutes.

Here are some helpful items to think about when developing your family escape plan.

1. Draw a map of your home showing all doors and windows.
2. Visit each room and locate two ways out.
3. All windows and doors should open easily so you can use them to get out.
4. Make sure your home has working smoke alarms and test them regularly.
5. Make sure your house or business numbers are easily visible from the street.
6. Be sure to include a family meeting place in your plan.
7. Be sure to practice your plan!

By following these simple rules and suggestions, you can make your home a fire safe one and help to prevent fire incidents from happening to you or your family. If you should have any questions regarding Fire Safety, please contact the Fire Station.

Change Your Clock - Change Your Battery



How to identify a census taker

In July, census takers began interviewing households around the country that have not yet responded online, by phone, or by mail to the 2020 Census. The U.S. Census Bureau is working to complete data collection as quickly and safely as possible, while ensuring a complete and accurate count as it strives to comply with the law and statutory deadlines.

Check their badge

All Census Bureau employees will present an official ID badge. It will include:

- > Their name
- > Their photograph
- > A Department of Commerce watermark
- > An expiration date

Upon request, the census taker will provide their supervisor's contact information and/or the phone number for the local Census Bureau regional census center.

The regional census center supervises the activities of all census takers who canvass communities and specializes in answering questions about them.

How to avoid a visit from a census taker:

Most households have received an invitation to participate in the 2020 Census. The best way to avoid a visit from a census taker at home is to complete the 2020 Census online, by phone, or by mail.
